Monday Morning Notes from Bishop Hyed



“Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples, “The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses’ seat; therefore, do whatever they teach you and follow it; but do not do as they do, for they do not practice what they teach.”

Matthew 23:1-3

Our leaders and familiars have much to teach us, but they are not infallible. Nor do they demonstrate or show us all that we need to learn.

In fact, sometimes it is the stranger who can and does most clearly and directly reveal to us most what we need to know or understand. The stranger may offer just the right true word that we need to hear, in that fleeting moment when our paths cross. For the stranger sees and hears you only in the present moment.

They do not know your past, or your inner world. And so, there lies in the stranger the potential for receiving truths that you may be uncomfortable hearing. Superficial truths, yes, like how you really do look in those jeans. But also more profound truths, like whether an expression you’ve used all your life carries sexist or racist undertones.

We never know when, in the passing stranger, we may encounter the Truth we need to meet.
