Monday Morning Notes from Bishop Hyed



"Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters." Luke 11:23

Heavenly Father when your Son Jesus miraculously healed people who had been damaged by the despair of social injustice, He was challenged by earthly powers for doing your Will and accused of doing the work of Beelzebub.

Today, we ask you that your Church rise with a Prophetic Voice, despite accusations about our intentions, when your faithful people who have come to the United States seeking stability and protection, are instead facing pain and suffering from immigration policies that treat them as criminals and in so doing humiliate and degrade them.

We recall that your Son too, was also treated as a criminal in His time for announcing your Kingdom of Peace and Justice.

As Jesus accompanied the sick and hurting, we are called to accompany those who have come seeking safety through many perils and uncertain paths. We are called to stand as the walls of your temple stand, providing a safe place to praise and give You thanks, for all who enter.

We remember that You make us all One through the Body of Your son, Jesus Christ. Amen —The Rev. Rigoberto Avila-Nativi, Priest in Charge, Iglesia Episcopal El Buen Pastor, Newburgh Last week, I had the opportunity to join the lenten book study for St. Mary's Castleton on Staten Island.

Rector **Sylvester Nkunwe** organized the group to read **Walter Brueggemann**'s **A Way Different**Than Our Own, which offers day-by-day scriptural reflections and prayers. I participated online.

The discussion was terrific. I always learn by listening in group bible study and conversation. I also really enjoy **Professor Brueggemann**, whose writings call us to live our faith outside of the prevailing culture.

Across the Diocese, it's wonderful to watch congregational formation programs. At my visitation last week, confirmands described coming to church to join **Mary McCarthy**'s Bible study at St. Luke's in Somers. **Bishop Shin** and I are leading a weekly online lectionary study— and **Heather Sisk** in St. Paul's in Pleasant Valley & **Margaret Gillespie** in St. John's New City are connecting back with their own congregations.

We're formed by the grace of the Holy Spirit in every moment of our lives. We'll continue to look for ways to connect and support local formation ministries.

• I'd like for us to help broaden the number of congregations including formation programs in their common life. Also, I really enjoy joining congregational formation programs— *if you invite me, then I'll come.* (It's especially possible online.)

I'm grateful for the faithful work that clergy & congregational leaders put into formation ministriesand know that it makes a difference.
