Putnam Chorale Performances

Putnam Chorale to perform 'An American Tapestry' in celebration of America's 250th



The 35-member Summer Ensemble of the Putnam Chorale will present "An American Tapestry," a seven-concert series across Putnam and Dutchess Counties this summer and fall, commemorating the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.

Blending music and history, An American Tapestry traces the evolving story of America through song—from the Colonial era to the present day. The program features works by early American composer William Billings alongside iconic music by Aaron Copland, Leonard Bernstein, and Irving Berlin, as well as spirituals and patriotic favorites.

"Through music, we trace the arc of freedom in this program," said Music Director Dr. Jason Tramm. "The repertoire reflects liberty, the American experience, and our shared heritage—featuring both rediscovered works and beloved classics like Battle Hymn of the Republic and God Bless America."

Many performances are presented in partnership with local historical societies and will take place in historically significant venues throughout the region, offering audiences a meaningful connection between the music and the sites where history unfolded.

One of the performances will be Thursday, May 28 at 7 p.m. at Zion Episcopal Church, Wappingers Falls. This performance is sponsored by the Wappingers Historical Society.

A highlight of the series will be the Sunday, May 31 concert at the First Reformed Dutch Church in Fishkill at 3 p.m., a landmark site that served as a hospital, prison, and as the New York Provincial Congress meeting place (1776–1777)—briefly making Fishkill the state capital.

Concerts are either free to the public (when underwritten by sponsoring organiza-

tions) or ticketed at modest rates: \$15 for adults, \$12 for seniors and students, and free admission for children 12 and under.

Monday Morning Notes from Bishop Heyd



We're committed to visit every church, every year.

The Diocese is 190 congregations, chaplaincies, and schools. Our pastoral fabric is *local*— and we want to stay connected.

The bishops and canons' team are all visiting congregations on Sundays and also visit clergy and congregations through the week.

- Bishop Shin, Canon Alissa Newton, and Canon for lay & clergy formation Tanya Wallace make weekly visits.

- Regional canons now focus visits on their areas of the Diocese.
- Archdeacon Denise LaVetty often makes Sunday visits as we support wider discernment for the diaconate.

I visited Trinity Church Manhattan yesterday. *Also yesterday:*

- Bishop Shin visited St. Mary the Virgin in Manhattan.
- Canon Newton participated in Women's Day at St. Luke's in the Bronx.
- Canon for New York City Victor Conrado visited St. Ambrose Manhattan.
- Canon for Dutchess County Lisa Ahuja attended the first combined service for St. Paul's and Virgen de Guadalupe in Poughkeepsie.
- Canon for Westchester & Putnam Counties SamOwen visited the Church of SS John, Paul & Clement in Mount Vernon.
- Canon Wallace participated in the celebration of music director Dennis Keene at Church of the Ascension in Manhattan.

On Saturday, Canon Conrado completed the first year-long weekend training for College for Congregational Development and Canon Ahuja led a retreat for the combined vestries of St. Andrew & St. Luke in Beacon, Church of the Resurrection in Hopewell Junction, and Trinity Church in Fishkill—an emerging Dutchess County collaborative.

Bishops visit congregations annually or bi-annually. It is always an honor to be with our congregations, to see what you're celebrating in your communities, to confirm or receive new members, and to hear your questions.

Canon visits provide relational support. Every canon has reached out to the congregations in their region to schedule a visit. Canons can preach & celebrate, meet with vestry and congregational leaders, guide formation programs, or just worship alongside your community.

- Arlene Bullard sets the bishops' visitation schedule annually;
- Canons schedule their visits directly; congregations can also reach out to a canon directly for supply, special events, or other support.

This new rotation means that we're visiting between seven and ten congregations each week. *We want to be with you.*

- This year, canons collectively have made 103 worship visits and held 51 meetings or retreats with vestries.
- I've been able to visit 49 congregations and chaplaincies since the beginning of the year—including three of our schools and three of our colleges.

Our ministries as diocesan staff are caring for clergy and supporting local communities. We'll continue to learn from increased connections.
