Bell Ringing for Semiquincentennial



This year is the Village of Fishkill's 125th annual reading of the Declaration of Independence, at 11:00 on the steps of the Village Hall. It will be followed by cupcakes and a mini concert by Alex Prizgintas, a classically trained cellist.

Then at 12:30, the Village of Fishkill will be inviting children and adults to Fishkill Reformed Church to help ring the bell 250 times, in celebration of American' Independence.

Trinity Church is looking for volunteer(s) **(with good hearing protection)** to ring Trinity's bell 250 times at 12:30 in joyful celebration with other Fishkill participants.

The National Bell Festival is recommending a nationwide ringing of bells at 2 PM, 13 times from coast to coast, to commemorate the original 13 colonies. Added or continuing volunteers to ring at 2 PM, are being asked for also. ***Again, good hearing protection is recommended as volunteers will be standing right next to the bell.***

Monday Morning Notes from Bishop Heyd



We're all Knicks fans now.

New York has been transfixed by the Knicks' playoff run- and overjoyed by their championship win on Saturday night. It's a great moment for New York. The World Cup brings a similar passion for fans around the world.

Our emotion about sports is deeply about identity and belonging. Most of us have a home team ([Go Heels.](#))

We're having an intense conversation about American identity and belonging as we approach our 250th birthday on July 4. It's happening in our neighborhoods across the country and from Washington, where we seem to be observing a [season of spectacle.](#)

We're launching a [Season of Freedom.](#)

We have a choice about what kind of civic fabric we join and the American identity that we embody. The Church in New York has shaped our civic fabric throughout American history. Like America, our Church has historically struggled with commitments to dignity, equality, and freedom. And, we struggle together.

We're celebrating the signing of the Declaration of Independence. We know our freedom has been the fight of every succeeding generation. We now observe Juneteenth as a country. We've made Pauli Murray a saint in our church. We celebrate Pride.

- We'll launch the Season of Freedom on Juneteenth with a dialogue by Cathedral Dean Winnie Varghese, Canon Kelly Brown Douglas, and Canon Stephanie Spellers.

- We'll also launch a video series about next steps in our commitment to reparations for slavery from Moses Commission Chair Marisa Sifontes.
- Over the next several weeks we'll continue to celebrate Pride together as well as the July 1 feast day for Pauli Murray.
- We'll connect to efforts to support voting rights in our communities.
- We'll join a Vigil for our Unfinished Democracy at the Cathedral on July 2 at 6 pm.
- We'll conclude the season in our congregations on Sunday, July 5.

Along the way, we'll hold our local observances across the Diocese— and will continue the conversation about identity, belonging, *and possibility* as we prepare for the celebration of our own 250th anniversary as a Diocese at convention next fall.

Thanks to the Public Witness Task Force —especially chair Anne Marie Witchger and Linda Etim, Jyostna Hariharan, and Lucy Breidenthal— for their work on planning the Season of Freedom.

- This moment is important. We remember from history class how the Declaration of Independence begins, *We hold these truths to be self-evident.*
- Here's how it ends: "And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor."

Let's pledge to each other a renewed commitment to dignity, equality, and justice. We can choose a Season of Freedom together.
