7:00 PM on Thursday July 16th located at the Poughkeepsie Senior Center, 14 Abes Way, Poughkeepsie, NY 12601

As Commissioner for Historic Preservation for the Town of Poughkeepsie, Dan Fannon will be presenting the last of the Commission's 250th Anniversary events on the American Revolution.

This will be a Lecture / Visual / Audio presentation detailing the history and importance of the Hudson River to the American cause for freedom, the struggle between the Continental and British forces to control both the river with its vital connection between the New England, Mid-Atlantic, and Southern states, as well as the vast agricultural resources of the Hudson River Valley. Since both sides rightly understood that if they could control the Hudson, they would win the war, the struggle along our beloved river from Manhattan to Albany turned our peaceful Hudson Valley into a crucial battlefield.
